The Master off to Ireland, so Robert Elliot made Locum Tenens.
Thursday 23.3.1820	King's Head Tavern Poultry.	~	R Elliot acted as Master. Richard Buck, George Lamb & John Edwards Allen sworn livery. Charles Walker had died. Thomas Wilson re-elected MP.
Thursday 22.6.1820	King's Head Tavern Poultry	~	R Elliot acted as Master. William Ibell sworn court. Livery to dine in September.
Thursday 28.9.1820	King's Head Tavern Poultry.	~	R Elliot acted as Master. Thomas Allen & James Wells sworn livery. James Green elected Master & James Blacket & Thomas Wilson as Wardens.
Thursday 14.12.1820	King's Head Tavern Poultry	James Green	Thomas Martin took the chair. Master & PW sworn in. Replied to letter from Commissioners re enquiries into charities. R Elliot thanked acting Locum Tenens.
Thursday 22.3.1821	King's Head Tavern Poultry	~	Thomas Wilson sworn RW. James Hayes had died 1.3.1821. His will left £200 to be distributed to poor at discretion of Master & Wardens. Invested in 3% Consols until further orders. The Clerk suggested instigating a fund for poor members & their widows.
Thursday 21.6.1821	King's Head Tavern Poultry.	~	Invested £275.17.3d of 3% Consols at 72 3/8ths for £200. Company to add funds to £300. Half yearly dividends. Proper records to be kept and to be read to the livery each Michaelmas meeting.
Thursday 27.9.1821	King's Head Tavern Poultry.	~	Sold Consols for £205.3.5d. Reinvested £300 in Reduced Annuities in names of James Blacket and Anthony Highmore. Distributions to be by gift not by pension. Application Forms to be designed with full details. Sums to be paid in person. William Trapp sworn livery. James Blacket elected Master, Thomas Wilson & William Ibell as Wardens. Roll of members to be printed. John Blades gave £210 to Hayes Trust.
Thursday 20.12.1821	King's Head Tavern Poultry.	James Blacket	Master & RW sworn in. Purchased £270.10.7d of Reduced annuities with John Blades' 200 Guineas. A further £165 was added by members.
Thursday 21.3.1822	King's Head Tavern Poultry.	~	A further £60 was invested. Annuity holding now up to £647.11.6d. First payments of 10/- made to 5 poor widows.

Thursday 20.6.1822	King's Head Tavern Poultry.	~	John Gray gifted £5 to Hayes Fund. Death recorded of Miles Mason. The fines for non-attendance were discontinued.

For Court, Dean had declined, Hight not replied, and Joseph Green fined £32.10/-. Jos Proctor to attend. Fine unpaid & cannot rescind - suggest £15. William Clay sworn court. Increase livery number to 200, the same as Spectacle Makers, at cost £50.
Thursday 18.3.1824	King's Head Tavern Poultry	~	Jos Proctor sworn court. Joseph Green paid fines. Loans from Wilson & Blades repaid. Agreed 90 livery total. James Hayes Trust now £702.16.2d. The widow Mary Karnock had died. New book to be produced with names of Livery. John Blades elected Master with Mark Morley and Joseph Proctor as Wardens.
Thursday 17.6.1824	King's Head Tavern Poultry	~	Master & Wardens installed. Court of Aldermen not yet considered increase in Livery.
Thursday 23.9.1824	King's Head Tavern Poultry	~	Charity requests were refused. Court of Aldermen met 1.2.1825 and agreed livery increase to 120. Fines on joining to be £20 plus 13/6d to the Clerk & 6/8d to the Beadle. Annual livery returns due by 24 Dec.
Thursday 16.12.1824	King's Head Tavern Poultry	John Blades	Beadle's dining was unnecessary expense so salary increased from 4 to 6 Guineas. Livery to be invited to Sept Dinner free.
Thursday 24.3.1825	King's Head Tavern Poultry	~	William Ibell resigned Court. William Trapp had died. Mark Morley elected Master, with Joseph Proctor & William Clay as Wardens. Dinner with the Livery.

The Clerk had circulated 20 Glass Sellers to take freedom or show just cause. Martin Morley had died. Richard Buck elected RW & to be advised. Charter & By-laws to be examined for increasing Quarterage.
Thursday 17.6.1830		~	Richard Buck resigned court & paid fines. Trueman had also paid fines. William Elliott sworn court. Mr Crook to hold over as RW. Livery Dinner in Sept. In future Court absentees to be fined 2/6d unless 3 present on set time of 3.30pm.
Thursday 23.9.1830		~	Thomas Scurr & Thomas Burnell elected court. Only Scurr sworn in. Elected William Crook as Master with William Clarke & William Barber as Wardens.
